

"Sanaubar Project Founder Graduates from the International Institute for Social Change Makers, kanthari, which brought together 22 participants from 11 different countries. This program equipped her with all the tools and skills needed to develop Sanaubar Project, focusing on community leadership and entrepreneurial for 1 year program. Until this day, more than 280 social change makers from 55 countries have graduated from this institute, giving rise to the establishment of over 160 non-profit organizations."



### A NEW JOURNEY HAS BEGUN TO ENHANCE REFUGEE LIVES AND TRANSFORM CAMPS INTO GREEN VILLAGES

"In late 2023, Sanaubar (pine tree) Project was launched, dedicated to improving the lives of refugees and transforming camps into green villages. The initiative aims to create positive change and sustainable communities for those in need. Sanaubar Project is an environmental and social initiative aimed to improve living conditions in refugee camps and revitalizing them into green villages capable of facing climate change-induced natural disasters.It utilizes Local Microclimate techniques to manage and regulate the climate in specific areas with defined objectives. The Sanaubar Project seeks to create a safe environment for refugees, providing them with necessary knowledge about climate change and local climate techniques to protect them from climate changerelated natural disasters. It also focuses on empowering refugees with skills needed to initiate the camp's transformation into a self-sufficient green village, addressing food and water security challenges threatening their future.

#### THE NEXT PILOT PROJECT FOR SANAUBAR

sanaubar's next pilot project is to build a sustainable environment in one of the biggest schools in Al-Baqaa camp for Palestinian refugee in Jordan. This project will aim to empower students with the necessary knowledge about climate change, natural disasters resulting from it, risk management and water management. These awareness sessions will be two days a week for a consecutive month, and these sessions will be followed by practical phases of everything the students learned during these sessions about climate change and how it can be addressed. By building a sustainable environment, the students will begin to participate in planting the school garden with various trees and plants that will give an aesthetic and picturesque green color to their school, which will give them the opportunity to sit under the shade of the trees to study and relax in their free time. They will also be able to eat from the tree that they planted themselves. They bear full responsibilities. These sessions and the practical phase that follows them will represent a qualitative change in the students' concept of climate change and its risks. They will become ambassadors among their families, friends and peers about climate change and how we can work to reduce the aggravation of its effects.
